Members were saddened to hear of the passing of long time member John (Liddo) Lidstone on 25th August, 2019.

Liddo obtained his Bronze Medallion in 1962 with Ocean Grove SLSC and transferred to Jan Juc in the early 70's and remained a member since that time.

Liddo patrolled for many years and was an integral part of competition at Juc in the water area, in particular Board, Ski, Iron Man and continued through to Masters collecting many wins and placings over the years. Not only was John a competitor in the Danger 1000 from its beginning, he provided water safety on his Ski or Board for many years. Liddo was always prepared to assist with Club fundraisers and events and would always answer the call to help out in many ways.

Via his longtime connection with Geelong Canoe Club he was a mentor and teacher to Juc members with their paddling skills firstly on the river and then in the surf.

John 'Liddo' Lidstone was a highly respected member and friend to many and is still missed.

Wow – Season 2019/2020 is one that won't be forgotten for a long time. Amidst the largest project our club has undertaken in its history, we have battled a season that presented heat, bushfires, dangerous surf conditions and a once in 100-year global pandemic.

The season has wrapped up, but the challenges experienced this season will have a lasting effect on individuals, the club and the community for a long time. These challenges have been a test of resilience that demonstrated the governance structures, financial management and operational arrangements implemented at our club over a number of years are robust and ensured that the Jan Juc SLSC remained strong and will be able to deliver the core operations of our club for many years to come.

Entering the season our thoughts were focussed on the completion of the clubs \$6.5 million-dollar building redevelopment project. Energised by the fact we received partial handover in December, it started to make everyone feel that the project was a reality and showed the space provided will provide great flexibility to adapt to any changes in lifesaving for many years to come.

The benefits were felt immediately making setup and pack up for events, training, requals and other activities far simpler than imagined. We hosted a Nipper carnival in February with 30+ clubs from around the state who took the opportunity to take a sneak peek and it was certainly the talk of the carnival with many clubs including some recently completed very envious.



I am pleased to say that the build is now complete with the clubhouse handed over from the builders to the Jan Juc SLSC for our use. Unfortunately, we have not been able to access the building due to COVID19 restrictions placed on life saving clubs in Victoria, but as soon as we complete the formalities of an official opening by the Federal, State and Local government stakeholders, we will open the doors and hold an event for members and the community you won't forget!

This project would not have been able to be delivered without the tireless work of many people over a number of years. I would like to thank all the board members, past and present for their help in making this project a strategic priority and reality. I would like to thank the Project Control Group (PCG) that was established just over 2 years ago. This group of individuals was established with a select set of skills to help lead and guide the club through the process and we are all extremely grateful for your time and commitment. The PCG was led by Pete Smith and contained Pete Saw, John Van Ooi, David Ulbrick, Andrew Van Meel and Clinton Fraser. If you see any of these people around the club, given them HUGE thanks. It's been a long haul, we hope you can now enjoy being in the club as opposed to work on the club – enjoy the change!

Although we have not had the social space and clubhouse, I continue to enjoy the opportunity to meet so many different members, new and not so new from a broad cross section of the club and broader community. Over the past 4 years as President I'm delighted to say that our people have showed incredible support and resilience in sticking by us while not having a home.

For a volunteer organisation to run effectively, we need everyone to put their hands up, roll up their sleeves and contribute in any way they can. I encourage everyone involved with our club to take the time to meet with new members, most of which live within our local community. We have transitioned from the little club across the creek to a large highly regarded Victorian club that provides a diverse range of opportunities to members in all areas of Surf Life Saving that can be carried through life. The core purpose of our club is our Life Saving patrols; however, we understand that people become involved in Life Saving for a variety of reasons and we need to support their involvement to ensure they remain involved. Surf Life Saving continues to change rapidly and as a club we will continue to adjust to the changes Surf Life Saving Australia, Life Saving Victoria and other stakeholders place upon us. To do this we have continued to build capability across all areas of our club - Life Saving; Training; Competition; Juniors/Nippers; Fund Raising; Administration; Finance & Governance and Building Redevelopment. The one constant in this movement

is change and we need to remain flexible and nimble to adjust as the movement continues to evolve.

One of the most important activities for Surf Life Saving Clubs happens away from the beach - fundraising. This activity is critical to the ongoing sustainability of the club. Surf Life Saving Clubs receive no ongoing financial support to run their core operations from any authority. Although we are under the emergency services umbrella, we need to raise every cent ourselves in order to operate. This makes achievements like the redevelopment of our clubhouse even more impressive. The work Brad Papworth continues to do is amazing and will become very challenging in the season ahead due to likely restrictions placed on our usual events and activities due to the pandemic. If you have any contacts that you think would be interested in a community partnership or providing funding support, please let Brad know.

Brad, working with James Taylor (JT), have done a great job in refreshing our logo and setting brand guidelines for our club to ensure we use it in the right way. Feedback from members and an extensive poll was taken to land on the final option and this will be rolled out before the start of the season – thanks for your efforts – exciting times.

For a long time, our training and patrols have been highly regarded by other clubs, due to their high standards and vigilance. This year was not any different and we look to offer more opportunities this season for award training and increase in rescue capability for the public attending our coastline. The introduction of a new flexible patrol roster and the RWC (Jetski) service from Jan Juc is also increasing the opportunities for members at our club for many years to come.

Our Juniors led by Brett Thompson and Nippers led by Kate Walsh have continued to be the largest area within our club. Nippers is often the first connection people within the community make with a Surf Life Saving Club and a stepping stone in the development of a young person, providing opportunity to compete in surf sports and surf education programs before obtaining the awards to patrol beaches. Retention of Nipper members is an important focus to ensure the natural flow into our patrols in future years and provide the valuable service to the community for many years to come.

In the area of competition, we continue to punch above our weight, achieving incredible results, pool, surf, beach, boats and lifesaving events. Although we were all disappointed in losing the chance to represent and compete in our State Titles and at Aussie's, the team has already started preparing for next season and we hope to be bigger and better than ever.

A huge thank you again to each of the Board Members responsible for each area, Pete, Mel, Geoff (Rass),

Brad, Bec, Steve, Brett (Thomo) and Tim - without their sacrifice and commitment this club would not be in the position we are in today. In particular, I would like to thank Mel for her strong financial presence and respected guidance throughout the year to ensure we make balanced decisions.

A special mention must also go to Sue and Meagan working in our office, your support is greatly appreciated, especially your flexibility in working arrangements and no fuss attitudes.

Finally, I would like to pass on my sincere thanks to all our members, club sponsors, event coordinators, Patrol Captains, trainers, assessors, Age Managers, coaches, Social Managers, Merchandise Managers, General Committee members, Audit, Finance & Governance Committee members and Building Subcommittee members for your support this season and look forward to seeing you all back next season.

Using previous years as a benchmark 2019/2020 has been a significant year in the annuals of the Jan Juc SLSC.

We have successfully completed the main portion of the building redevelopment. Even with shutdown I have seen many persons visit the site over the past three months, to those that have I am sure you will join me in amazement at the new facility. From all angles, even the water aspects the understated facility blends into the landscape, as it was designed to. Only the change to the ramp – an external stakeholder requirement – alters some aspects.

While it has not been an easy development, managing six external stakeholders, combined with significant unforeseen hurdles that put budgetary pressure on the project, it has been very rewarding. While this has been my 14 year project I could not have executed this grand plan without those that have contributed along the journey.

The Building Sub Committee that was instrumental in navigating the funding & the six external stakeholders. Not many know the intricacies of the journey we undertook to get the permits, permissions, authorisations and funding to allow the commencement of building, however if you corner a member of the Building Sub Committee they will explain the often rollercoaster it was.

Taking over from the BSC in 2017, the Project Control Group has managed unforeseen in-ground challenges, continued stakeholder oversight and completing a build during an unprecedented period in our lives. The PCG has been instrumental in holding the Builder – Hutchinson & the Project

Manager – Turner Townsend Thinc to account and maximizing member value from the funds deployed.

Fellow Board members – tasked with overseeing a project that was possibly not in their original scope of role, they have listened and assisted in this process.

Mostly I would like to thank you, the members. We members collectively contributed over \$1,000,000 to the project, an amazing achievement for any club to have the long term vision and fortitude to hold the line when at times it felt like the crystallization of this vision was not possible.

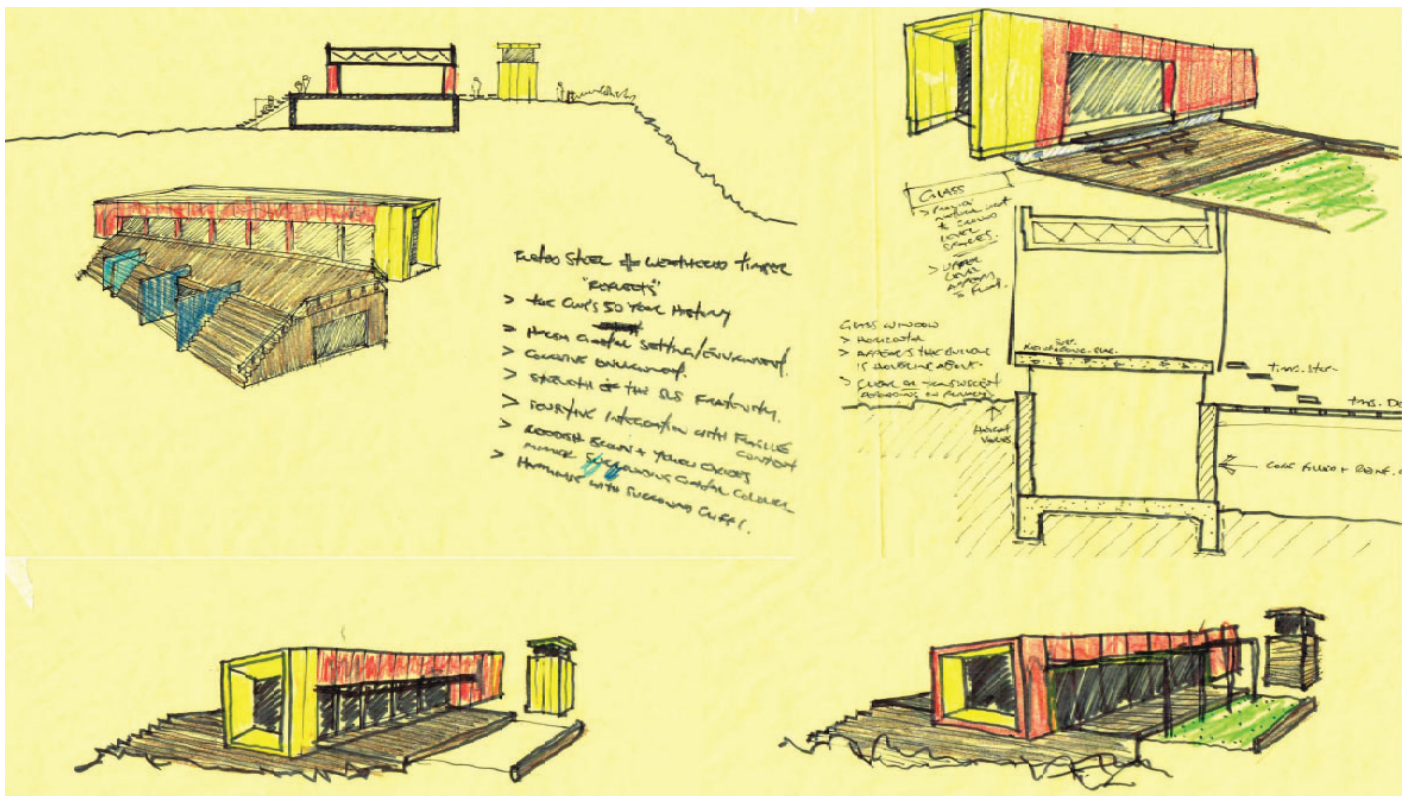
We still have some work to do. The value management has meant aspects of the facility that were in the builders scope have required rationalisation and with the current economic landscape we are very conscious of fiscal responsibility. Most of the tasks remaining will be completed by volunteers.

If you have been to the club you will also see the radio/observation tower has been re-fitted and we now have a space for a café below this. While at present we cannot open we hope we might be able to by summer.

bec johnson **LIFESAVING SERVICES MANAGER**

What a season it has been, unlike any other recorded in the history of our club.

We commenced the season with the roll out of our new blended patrol roster giving members the opportunity to roster themselves to days/patrols that suited them around work, social and school commitments. This was a new initiative we developed having looked in to other club models from around Australia and devising something that we thought would best suit the volunteer members of Jan Juc SLSC. During the off season, we called for expressions of interest for members who would like to be part of a core patrol group. These were our experienced members who held awards required for each patrol. These members were split in to 8 core patrol groups to ensure we would always have a full list of required awards and experience on the beach at every patrol. We then gave the rest of the patrolling members the opportunity to slot themselves within the roster to dates suited to them.

In December we were fortunate enough to gain access to the ground floor of the new clubhouse. This meant we could operate most of our essential lifesaving equipment out of the clubhouse which was a huge relief. The highlight was when the hot water was finally turned on and members were able to have a warm shower after patrol.

Unfortunately in March, the Club in conjunction with Lifesaving Victoria had to make the decision to cancel patrols for the remainder of season 2019/20 due to COVID-19. We were unable to provide a safe place for our members to provide the service at our beach as all public facilities including the clubhouse and public amenities were officially closed along the Surfcoast. This was then followed by a State wide closure and hence the official patrol season was cut short. During this time, we worked with Lifesaving Victoria and put together a COVID Call Out Crew. We rostered a group of core patrol members to a call out response crew that were available each weekend until Easter should there be an incident that required our immediate response. Fortunately, we were not required to deploy this group at any point for the remainder of the season, however I would like to thank all those members who volunteered to be on call during this time.

What else did our patrolling members get up to this season:

Volunteer member deployment

On the 27th June, Lifesaving Victoria (LSV) was requested by Emergency Management Victoria (EMV), to assist in the assembling of new saliva based test kits, being distributed to members of the public as part of Operation Darsi. This required a fast deployment of our operational members from numerous clubs across the state to achieve the appropriate numbers.

Having concluded the deployment at 9pm Sunday 29th June, LSV supplied 102 volunteers across 20 life saving clubs including Jan Juc and assisted in packing 16,000 testing kits.

On the 6th July, LSV was again requested to provide resources to assist in the logistical food relief activities in Flemington (called Operation Beneserre). The main roles of the LSV volunteers were to move boxes of food and grocery items from larger staging areas closer to the residential towers that were placed in compulsory COVID lockdown.

There were around 40 volunteers from LSV, supported by a command structure on site, and working closely with DHHS, VICSES, Victoria Police and other agencies.

Finally, I would like to once again thank my amazing Lifesaving Services Sub Committee for their continued support throughout the season. Without your support, the Lifesaving division of the club would not be able to continue to operate as successfully as it does each year.

As always our Juc first aid gear passed inspection without question and I am grateful for how well our gear has been maintained this season. Thanks to all those whom took the time to clean up at the end of patrols and helped to ensure our equipment is in working order. A special mention to Rass for his first aid room maintenance work and for ensuring our oxygen supply was topped up all season, much appreciated.

Our makeshift "site hut" first aid room ran its second season successfully. It's time to say goodbye and prepare our brand new bright and shiny first aid room for the coming season. I will be busy during the off season fitting it out, making sure we have enough

space and easy access to everything required in an emergency response. Exciting to have a new clean space to work with....

This coming season will also see much needed upgrades to our old Cardiac Science Defibrillators. These are hitting use by and maintaining them has become costly. The trainer versions are no longer functioning appropriately and are no longer available for purchase. Via grants we have purchased 2 new beach defibs and 2 matching interactive trainer models, all top notch technology offering simplicity with a few advanced options and improvements in training.... More information to come and training will be arranged to ensure all members are up to date and comfortable with the new gear! Another off-season project.

As we all know, IRB's, in the control of qualified drivers and crew, are one of the most effective rescue crafts for many of the clubs rescue situations and event/training safety operations. Therefore keeping our eight craft well maintained in good running condition is essential.

Firstly, big team effort to have our IRB's pass the gear inspection last year. Many lessons were learnt from Dan, Brett and others on trouble shooting the sometimes problematic starting and running of the motors. Servicing was made easier this year with a good suggestion from Aaron to have a mobile service mechanic check and repair, saving lengthy trips to the far side of Melbourne.

Getting back into the vast space provided by the new club was a welcome relief, where we have ample

facilities to easily prepare IRB's for patrols and events. I was very pleased to be part of the successful IRB driver and crew training course held early 2020.

Congratulations to new IRB Crew Oliver, Brad, Brendan & Steve; to new IRB Drivers Olivia and Jeff, with Jason soon; to new Trainers Finn and myself ; and Trainer and new Assessor Anthony.

Thanks to Marcus, Issy & Dan for training and Mike from Anglesea SLSC for assessing. There are a few more people to finish training. Well done everyone.

We will host another training course aiming at later this year, so if anyone is interested please contact Anthony Reyntjes or myself.

When starting patrols we will have a cut down wheelie bin to pre run – test the motors while on the IRB to avoid having to lift them into the tank or dry run which can damage the motors on consecutive dry test starts if the motor hasn't been used on patrol.

We had nearly 300 nippers enrolled in the Jan Juc SLSC Nipper Program throughout 2019-20, our biggest and busiest season ever!

The Nipper training program began on Sunday mornings in mid-October for U8-U13 participants who were keen to increase their surf lifesaving skills, keep fit, and represent Jan Juc at carnivals. For the first time, we ran a Come 'n Try Day at the beginning of the season which gained a lot of interest and brought a number of new families into the Nipper Program. Due to popular demand we started a regular U7 group with numbers in this group swelling to 37 throughout the season.

Our Surf Education Program once again commenced just after Christmas for two and a half weeks including the Annual Door Knock, First Aid Night and Beach and Surf Life Saving activities for U7-U13s.

The Summer program was once again challenged

with no clubhouse to use as a base due to the redevelopment. We again utilised a number of community venues to accommodate our program including the Surf Coast Sport and Recreation Centre for our First Aid Night, the Jan Juc Cricket Club for our Welcome BBQ and Door Knock and St Therese Catholic Primary School for our Surf Education Award Presentation Night.

Thank you to all of the Nipper families who roamed the streets of Jan Juc for our door knock appeal which was another huge fundraising success raising over \$5000 for the club. A big thank you to Jodie Reyntjes and her team for organisation of the Door Knock this year.

The Surf Education Program was again ably co-ordinated by Steve Scammell and I thank him for his work in putting together a program that was thoroughly enjoyed by all of the kids who attended. One of the highlights of the Surf Education program for

our kids is always the First Aid Night! Thank you to Heidi Taylor who organised the paramedics to come along to teach our Nippers in such a fun and informative manner. The Summer Surf Education program would not be possible without the dedication of the Age Group leaders, juniors from the club who have previously completed the Nipper Program, who then come back to help and encourage the younger members to learn and improve their life saving skills. We can't thank you enough for being such wonderful role models for the up and coming members of our club. We also thank all of the older Bronze Medallion holders (including parents and other club members) who came along to help with water safety and to teach different components of the Summer Program alongside the Age Group leaders.

The 2020 Victorian Junior State Championships (for U9-U13) were held in Warrnambool over the weekend of 7-9 March with a new 2 ½ day format to accommodate for the large number of competitors from around the State. Jan Juc had over 100 nippers regularly competing throughout the season, with large numbers of teams and individual competitors qualifying for the State Championships, always a fun weekend to end the season! It was also a weekend with a large number of successes across all age groups and many happy Nippers displaying medals around their necks. Our Coaches, Team Managers, Officials and Water Safety for our Nippers program volunteer their time each Wednesday and Sunday (as well as on Carnival weekends) to coach the kids, as well as working on training programs, picking teams, ensuring our children are safe in the water and giving them the opportunity to be able to compete in carnivals throughout the season. They are such a dedicated group of parents who work tirelessly throughout the season to give our Nippers the best opportunities to improve both their life saving and competition skills, as well as being so supportive of all of the kids despite the huge variation in abilities that they are faced with. A

huge thank you to everybody who has helped out with the Nipper program this season, especially those parents who have newly achieved their Bronze Medallion just so they can hop in the water to help out. We also thank everyone who helped out with first aid, trailer packing and towing, and helping out on the BBQ... every little bit helps! We will be asking all parents to take on a role helping out next season, so have a think throughout the next few months how you can help out!

A few more special thank yous must go to:

- Anthony Reyntjes who once again took on the role as Board Manager this season. This is a challenging role, especially with the growing numbers of Nippers and the demand for use of club boards!
- Jodie Reyntjes who was not only the U12 Team Manager, but was also the Nippers Catering Co-ordinator - organising the BBQ for hungry Nippers at the end of training sessions, and also organising the food for our special Nipper nights.
- Brett Thompson, the Juniors Manager who supported and provided me with advice throughout the season as Nippers Manager.
- Sue Bettanin in the office who is amazingly organised and has helped me in so many ways!

We look forward to the 2020/21 Nipper Season in our new Clubhouse! I will be stepping down as Nipper Manager next season after three years and we will be developing a new Nippers committee to co-ordinate all of the activities. Please contact us if you are interested in being part of the committee.

Cassie Moss was a very capable course manager who looked after all the paperwork and coordinated all course details. Thanks heaps Cass.

We handed the training and organisation of the SRC and Bronze courses back to our younger member leaders. These courses are the perfect opportunity to not only train new lifesavers, but also to provide the chance for our junior members to take on leadership roles within the Club - Train to retain!

Brooke O'Brien and her team did a fantastic job getting our newly graduated Nippers to become our new crop of lifesavers.

Indy Flexman led a great team of our highly qualified

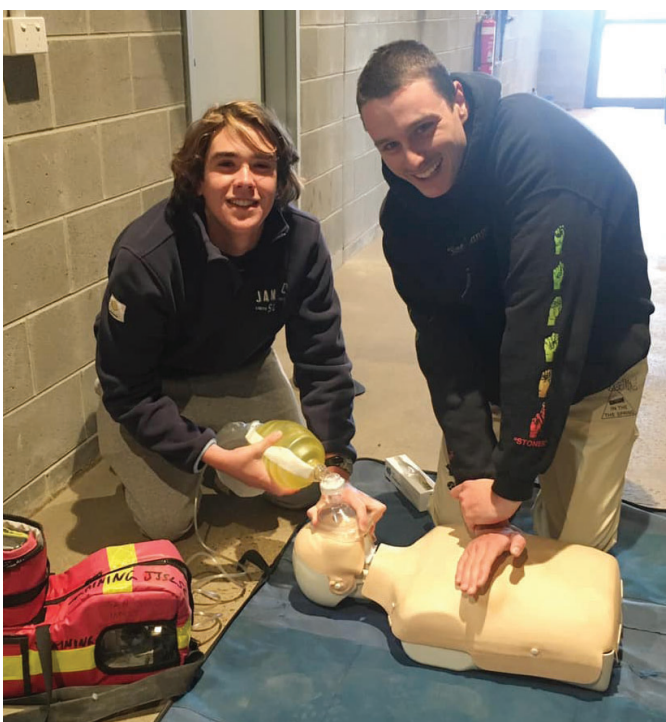
young trainers, some who doubled up from training at SRC. Both trainers and candidates had a great time on these courses and coped very well without a clubhouse.

I foresee more online courses, which will challenge my IT capabilities, but with the guidance of LSV we will aim to run all required courses. Please keep an eye on the Club's social media and your Club Mail for advertised LSV run courses. Our state body is more equipped to run online courses at the moment and this may benefit members, particularly those hoping to take on lifeguarding roles this summer.

The summer rolled on and it was an extremely busy 3 days with the Golf Day rolling into the Bells Bash and Danger Swim Series. Over my tenure in this role and as Event Director I have been extremely lucky to have so many extremely passionate and experienced people to work with to ensure the Bash and Danger remain relevant. The events space has now become so crowded and we are competing for participants' valuable event spend. Over the past 6 years in this role we have continued to review, challenge and change parts of the events to ensure they remain relevant. There have definitely been times when questions have been raised about the continued viability of the events however the board and myself have been strong in our convictions that the events are about fundraising, but more importantly they act as amazing gathering opportunity for our members and valuable branding tool in the community keeping the Jan Juc SLSC top of mind. The adjustments to the Bash run course in 2019, to provide a better experience for our competitors, saw our number slowly grow to back over 600 competitors in 2020. The day presented great running weather and our relocated registration area continues to provide a more visible and easier to access option for competitors.

The 2020 Danger Swim Series saw the introduction of the 5km swim to add to our existing 500m, 1km & 2.5km. The introduction of the 5km was an initiative borne out of a partnership with Swimming Victoria to deliver a state-wide series. The Danger was the

only swim chosen outside of the bay and we were extremely humbled to be selected and excited to take on the challenge of delivering another swim in an already jam-packed day. The addition of the 5km definitely had a positive impact on our numbers with entries exceeding 1200 for the first time in 6 years.

It wouldn't be a Danger Swim Series without some challenges being thrown at us. The day kicked off with a new timing system being introduced by our timing partner which caused delays in registration – the cool heads of Jodie Reyntjes and her amazing team to ensure we navigated through this got the events kicked off with minimal delays. The conditions started off perfectly for the 2.5km and 5km however we were aware that the winds were going to increase and cause some issues for the 500m and 1km. Almost on cue and as we started the 1km the wind kicked and caused the event to be put on hold twice due to shifting buoys and concerns for the safety of our competitors. Again, cool heads prevailed and thanks to Pete Smith and the Water Safety team were able to adjust the course and provide a better and safer outcome for our competitors.

The ability for our teams across both the Bash and Danger to adapt to situational change is remarkable but not surprising understanding the hundreds of hours that are dedicated to planning for the events. A big thank you to all of our volunteers over the 2 days for your dedication to the events and making them the success they are. A personal big thank you to Ian Blanchonette, Jodie Reyntjes, Bruce Dunlop, Andrew Mather, Davina Jackson, Peter and Dan Smith, Pete Saw and Thomo for the months of work prior to the events that you dedicate to ensure these events run as smoothly as they do and putting up with my hundreds of calls and emails. With all that said it was an amazing relief to see that all the hard work and planning paid off with great entry numbers and more importantly that translating to a combined increase of 20% in profit from the previous year to \$40,400. Congratulations to all involved.

Our Intersection Collections this year were taken on by our Boat Captain Shayne Lee and partner Leanne who did a fantastic job in unusual circumstances. Thank you both for your time and dedication to the clubs fundraising. This is always a challenging role however one of the most rewarding for the club financially. Congratulations to Grace Lightfoot who was awarded Victorian Lifeguard of the Year in July last year at the Surf Life Saving Victoria Awards of Excellence.

In November Grace was also awarded the National DHL Lifeguard of the Year at the SLSA Awards of Excellence held on the Gold Coast, making history as the first female to do so.

Grace started as a Nipper in 2008, following along the pathway to obtain her Bronze Medallion and then various Lifesaving awards.

Her Lifeguard duties commenced in 2014. She was appointed Team Leader in 2016 and this year she was a Mentor at the Advanced Lifesaving Camp.

'Go Juc' Jan Juc Surf Club is a private group for members only. We currently have almost 700 members in this group which allows us to share more member specific information. It also allows members to interact by sharing photos and stories or ask questions. All posts require admin approval. This group is probably the best place to get information or answers to queries in real time and I would encourage all members to join this group.

Jan Juc SLSC Competition Crew is another private group for members only and currently has 236

members. This is where Tim Watson will post everything related to competition. As with the 'Go Juc' group, posts require admin approval.

Jan Juc SLSC Building Redevelopment is a public Facebook group with 200 members which shares information on the building redevelopment.

Instagram

Instagram has an increasing following (currently 1000) which seems to be made up of more younger members, other surf lifesaving clubs and local businesses. Members should note that Instagram is a public forum and so member sensitive information will not be shared in this medium. Members are encouraged to also join the 'Go Juc' Jan Juc Surf Club private Facebook group for more member specific information.

Website

The Club's website contains an enormous amount of information including Club contact details for Directors and committee members, membership renewal/application information, management & governance information, Club programs, a secure members area for patrol rosters and much more.

Club Mail

The Club is very aware that not every member is on Facebook or Instagram which is why we also send out an E-newsletter once a week during the season via email to every member. This ensures every member has access to Club information and also allows us to distribute more detailed messages about the Club's recent accomplishments, current projects and future goals as well as communication from LSV and SLSA. It is also an excellent medium for recognising the contributions of Club sponsors and donors.

Having access to all of these communication platforms on my phone means I can generally distribute information in good time. There is no substitute for maintaining effective communication with our members from a central source.

We save money by producing the Annual Report in-house and only printing the required hard copies and making it available to members via the website. Annual Result

The Club reports a profit for the 2020 year of \$3,886,399. This compares to a profit for 2019 of \$1,024,820. Both years contain significant non-operating items relating to the redevelopment of the clubhouse. The current year profit is after recording \$3,708,000 as capital grant revenue associated with the clubhouse redevelopment. In 2019 this was \$950,000. Club redevelopment costs have been capitalised and are reflected on the balance sheet, not in the annual profit and loss statement. Excluding capital grant revenue, the underlying profit for 2020 was \$178,399. In 2019 this was \$74,820.

Business as usual – ongoing operational

Up until the end of February 2020 all 'business as usual' areas of the Club were operationally and financially stable and the financial statements for the year largely reflect that stability. We had even started to see some activity through our downstairs 'temporary' bar! Covid 19 related closures put on hold many Club activities including the early cessation of patrols, cancellation of senior states competition, closure of the clubhouse and deferral of all clubhouse activities, including the bar and the progression of commercial partnerships discussions. The impacts of these Covid 19 changes will largely be felt in the coming financial year and are discussed below under 'Impact of Covid 19'.

The 'business as usual' areas of the Club have remained very stable financially. Clubhouse activities, lifesaving services, lifesaving skills and development, juniors, competition, and operational capital equipment expenditure have all reported stable, predictable financial outcomes.

Income and expenses across these core club activity areas showed little unexpected material variance over levels of income and expenses in 2019. Notable areas of variance over 2019 include:

- Lower salaries cost reflecting the deferral of replacement of part time staff who left during 2019.
- \$20,000 in Covid 19 related grants from state and federal governments received in April 2020.

There were no other significant business as usual variances of note. Sound monitoring and cost control by Club committee and executive have ensured no surprise outcomes across core areas.

Fundraising and Events

The fundraising and events team delivered another stellar year of fundraising events, with combined 2020 income from our core events (Danger Ocean Swim Series, Bells Bash Cliff Run, Golf Classic Day, and Grand Final Eve Lunch) being \$177,493. This is well ahead of our combined 2019 income of \$157,521. Record Danger 1000 swim entries and a rebound in Golf Day revenue were the most significant contributors to this difference. The combined net profit from these events was \$83,853 compared to

\$68,297 in 2019 and \$84,892 in 2018. It is pleasing to see the resilience of this stable of events in our community, although the impact of Covid 19 restrictions on these events in the coming year is a major risk to our finances in the short term.

Clubhouse development activity

The financial aspects of the clubhouse redevelopment dominated the Clubs financial activity this year. The financial components of the activity during the year included:

- \$5,139,529 in capitalised project development costs (2019: \$279,994) bringing the total capital value of the project at year end to \$5,660,907. (2019: \$521,378).
- Recognition of capital grants revenue during the year of \$3,708,000 comprising \$2,108,000 from Victorian government grants and \$1,600,000 from Federal Government grants.
- Recognition of further building redevelopment philanthropic income in the form of building donations made and treads sold of \$115,500 this year. This compares to \$52,230 in 2019.
- The Club entered into a loan agreement with Bendigo Bank and had fully drawn down on a \$400,000 debt facility as of 30 April 2020. Bendigo Bank has been supportive of the Club during the current Covid 19 environment and agreed to a 6-month deferral of repayments of principal and interest. Repayments are due to commence in November 2020.

After year end a further \$1,047,000 has been paid to the main works contractor. At year end, the Club estimated its contractual capital commitments under existing contracts associated with the redevelopment to be approximately \$1,100,000. These commitments are being funded from a mix of club undrawn government grant commitments and club cash reserves.

Maintaining our operating assets – continued investment

The Club purchased \$27,398 in equipment assets during the year including a second-hand ATV, a generator, 2 x defibrillators and a double ski. This compares to \$37,150 invested in equipment during 2019 for one Thundercat rescue craft, 2 IRB motors, 1 IRB fuel cell and a Patrol equipment trailer. Additionally, the Club paid a deposit on a new Surf Boat and took delivery of the boat during the year.

Impact of Covid 19 on the Financial Statements

The Club's financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and the Board is of the opinion that the Club will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due. The Board has made this assessment as at the date of the signing of the audit report. In reaching this conclusion the Board has considered the reasonably foreseeable impact of Covid 19 restrictions on Club activities,

including fundraising events and has prepared a cash flow forecast through to 30 September 2021 using a reasonable set of assumptions in the current environment. The forecast shows that the Club expects to maintain its ability to pay its debts as and when they fall due throughout the forecast period. Key assumptions underpinning this forecast include:

- Maintaining membership revenue at FY2020 levels
- Complete loss of fundraising income and associated expenses associated with all coming season fundraising events including Grand Final Eve, Golf Day, Bells Bash and Danger 1000.
- No fundraising income from doorknocks or tin rattles.
- Utilisation of JobKeeper support payments through to March 2021.
- Receipt of all contracted and previously committed grant and philanthropic income.
- Modest commercial income from Clubhouse utilisation by the Club and third parties from February/March 2021 onwards.
- Bendigo Bank debt repayments commencing from November 2020.
- \$50,000 allowance toward completion of aspects of the clubhouse that were value managed out of the Building Contractor's scope.

- Freezes on all non-essential expenditure and capital items, unless expenditure can be offset by grants, philanthropic support, or other associated income.

Notwithstanding Covid 19 circumstances are likely to severely impact our fundraising activities this season, the combination of fiscal restraint, government support by way of JobKeeper, the support of our members in maintaining their memberships and the operating reserves that have been maintained by the Club, are expected to sustain the Club for the coming 12 months.

The finance team has had a busy year supporting the administration of the delivery of our wonderful new facility and we are hopeful that we can hurry up and use it to fully support our lifesaving services, member and community activities and to also generate a reliable revenue stream that helps repay our borrowings and underpin a strong financial future.

NOTE 10 - BUILDING REDEVELOPMENT

The Surf Club substantially completed the redevelopment of the Clubhouse during the year. During the year the club incurred and capitalised \$5,139,529 of development costs and carries total capitalised costs of \$5,660,907 at the end of FY19 (FY19: \$521,378). At year end, the club has estimated its remaining capital commitments under existing contracts associated with the redevelopment to be approximately \$1.1million. These commitments will be funded from a mix of club funds, undrawn government grant commitments, borrowings and continued philanthropic efforts.

NOTE 11 – GOODS AND SERVICES TAX AND TAX REFORM

The Surf Club is registered for Goods and Services Tax which is remitted on a cash basis. The Surf Club is also endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office as an Income Tax Exempt Charitable Entity and as a Deductible Gift Recipient.

NOTE 12 – ASSOCIATION DETAILS

Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club is an association incorporated under the Victorian Associations Incorporation Act and is domiciled in Victoria.

NOTE 13 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS & GOING CONCERN - COVID 19

The impact of Covid 19 on future club operations remains uncertain as at the date of signing of these financial statements. Notwithstanding, the Club has prepared conservative cashflow forecasts for the twelve months from the date of these financial statements that indicates that the club will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due. Key assumptions in conservative cash flow statement modelling include: Loss of income and associated costs for seasonal fundraising events, continuation of JobKeeper funding to March, limited commercial income resuming in March 2021, receipt of previously committed grant and philanthropic funding, commencement of repayment of borrowings in November 2020, freezes on all non essential expenditure unless it can be funded through additional grants or sponsorships, retention of memberships and associated fees.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

I have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club Inc., which comprises the Statement of Income, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash Flows and Notes to the Financial Statements for the financial year ended 30 April 2020.

Basis for Qualification

As is common for organizations of this type, it is not practicable for the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club Inc to maintain an effective system of internal control over monies received until its initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, my audit in relation to cash receipts was limited to amounts recorded.

Auditor's Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, subject to the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the limitation discussed in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report of the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club Inc presents a true and fair view of the results of the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club Inc operations and cash flows for the year ended 30 April 2020 and its financial position as at that date in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the accounts.

Basis for opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of my report. I am independent of the entity in accordance with the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic)* and the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's *APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* (the Code) that are relevant to our my audit of the financial report in Australia. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our [my] opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the registered entity's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by responsible entities.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the entities' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the registered entity's ability to continue as a going concern. If I conclude that a material uncertainty exists, I am required to draw attention in my auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify my opinion. My conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of my auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the entity to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I communicate with the Board regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I identify during my audit.
